

DEMOGRAPHIC SITUATION¹ IN UKRAINE IN JANUARY—AUGUST 2014

As of 1 September, 2014 the population of Ukraine was estimated at 42977,4 thsd. persons. During January—August 2014 the population decreased by 95,7 thsd. persons that amounted to 3,3 persons per 1000 population.

The population decline was exclusively due to natural decrease – 109,2 thsd. persons, concurrently a migration gain –13,5 thsd. persons was registered.

In comparison with January—August 2013 the volume of a natural decrease increased by 2,2 thsd. persons (from 3,7 to 3,8 persons per 1000 population).

A significant surplus of the number of deaths over live birth remains: per 100 deaths – 74 live births.

The birth rate has increased from 10,9 ‰ in January—August 2013 to 11,0 ‰ in January—August 2014.

The death rate increased from 14,6‰ in January— August 2013 to 14,8‰ in January— August 2014.

At the age under 1 year died 2438 infants. The death rate of infants under 1 year of age decreased from 8,0 per 1000 live birth in January—August 2013 to 7,7 - in January— August 2014.
