

DEMOGRAPHIC SITUATION IN UKRAINE IN JANUARY—FEBRUARY 2015¹

As of 1 March, 2015 the population of Ukraine was estimated at 42895,7 thsd. persons. During January—February 2015 the population decreased by 33,6 thsd. persons that amounted to 4,8 persons per 1000 population.

The population decline was exclusively due to natural decrease – 38,2 thsd. persons, concurrently a migration gain – 4,6 thsd. persons was registered.

A significant surplus of the number of deaths over live birth remains: per 100 deaths – 64 live births.

The birth rate in January—February 2015 was 9,7 persons per 1000 population and the death rate – 15,2 persons per 1000 population.

At the age under 1 year died 561 infants. The death rate of infants under 1 year of age was 7,3 per 1000 live birth.
